Dear ENW Supporters,

Our ENW team has just returned from our 7th trip to the Philippines. We were there nearly three weeks and had the privilege to conduct three training conferences...one of which was a pioneer conference in a new area on the island of Luzon. It was in the city of Loaog.



There were many highlights of this tour. Following are a few:

1—JoJo Reynon, a national pastor who has been under ENW training/mentoring for the last six years and was a trainer for ENW on the Island of Negros in April, also joined us as a trainer this year in Loaog. If this training base continues (the first year is usually a survey trip to see if the training offered will be received well and then, if so, plan for an eight year strategy), JoJo will be one of our main trainers. JoJo is not only consistently attending ENW training conferences himself, but works very diligently to make sure he has a good delegation from his church attending as well.

2—Arnel Caimol, also a national pastor who has attended ENW training consistently for the last six years, will join the ENW national training team next year. Pastor Caimol, directs a Bible Institute, of which the ENW training units have become an integral part, brings his Institute students with him each year to the conference.

Both Pastors Caimol and Reynon are using the ENW material in their churches to equip their congregations.

This is exciting because we not only want these pastors to focus on the next generation of young shepherds in our pioneer conferences...but we want them to equip the people they presently shepherd as well.

The material these two men will be handling next year, as they help in the training, will be: Foundations for Biblical Counseling.

3—Before we left Naga City, the location of our last conference for this tour, we planned yet another pioneer conference on a nearby island. There are four national pastors from the Bicol region who will share the bulk of the training responsibility. All four of these men helped with a conference last year and are very capable...they are “faithful, capable” men who are seeking to “train others also” (II Timothy 2:2). They are pastors Let Nava, Vannie, Allen and Larry. We are, by the grace of God, looking forward to this new venture next year.

4—It was a huge blessing to have some extended conversation with a couple of the pastoral staff members of the International Baptist Church in Naga City, the location of our last conference mentioned above. These men shared with Kemper (my training companion this year and a deacon in our church—Faithway Baptist of Greensboro) and I how the church has consistently integrated the ENW training throughout her teaching ministries. It has become the main source of S.S. preparation.

For example, last year (year 6 for this conference) we taught Foundations for Knowing and Worshipping God. When we arrived at the church this year we saw the yearly focus for each month for 2013. It was pictured on a banner that was hanging in the auditorium of the church and shown in this report letter for your encouragement. Each month emphasized one of the twelve attributes of God we dealt with in 2012. These attributes are being highlighted in the monthly preaching calendar and are being taught pervasively throughout the classes. What a blessing!



Thank you for making these reports of growing, developing Biblical men and ministries possible through your prayers and financial gifts.

Many of you are aware of the church plant in Somerset Pa. that ENW has been assisting. I will be traveling up there again in a couple of weeks. We are working hard to train elders and leaders within this young, growing congregation. There will be two weekend conferences on this trip. The first one will be Hermeneutics—principles of bible study and the second will be Homiletics—the organization and development of Bible messages. This will be an informal inauguration of sorts of *Grace Shepherd's Institute*. As we work with *Grace Bible Fellowship* to plant more churches in the greater Somerset County area, we want to have a local church based and authorized training center to equip the men who will be leading these new congregations. Since the biblical model of equipping shepherds is “pastors train pastors in the context of pastoral ministry”...we want the classroom to be the local church. If any of you are interested in the possible development of a similar training center under your church’s authority, feel free to contact me for any questions and/or discussion regarding this. It is an exciting venture for us. One of the things that makes it even more exciting is the lead pastor of *Grace Bible Fellowship*, Mike Faidley, is a man whom I have had the privilege to mentor over the last twelve years. We ordained him at Bethany Baptist Church when I pastored there. He served as my youth pastor and, since the founding of ENW, he has traveled with our training team to Uruguay, South America and the Philippines several times.

I trust your heart is rejoicing in what God is doing in developing men both stateside and abroad who will be equipped to shepherd future congregations. To God be all the glory!

Chris continues to work at the Winston Salem Rescue Mission. Her faithfulness to this task for the last 7 & ½ years has made it possible for me to travel as I have. Her willingness to do this for the “sake of His Name” humbles me and causes me to be grateful for a wife such as she.

We are still attempting to reach full support status (we hover around 70%). Understandably times are difficult for churches and families. Your prayers regarding this...and possible consideration of being part is appreciated greatly.

Our next equipping tour abroad will be to the Ivory Coast in February. James Bledsoe, the lead pastor of our sending church and Dan Hicks, one of our elders, will be accompanying me as fellow trainers on this trip. We look forward with much anticipation to this fifth year in this country. The unit will be Foundations for Church Organization and Administration.

I want to say again thank you! I think often of the passage (I just had the privilege of preaching from this text Sunday) in III John 8—we are “fellow helpers to the truth”. That sort of sums it up. You and I fall into one of two categories...one who goes or one who sends those who go. That is the teamwork of the mission of the church. I extend humble thanks to all of you who help us go...for the sake of His name.
